



Awami League Will Be Met with Resistance if They Take to Streets: Rashed Khan

Md. Rashed Khan, General Secretary of Gono Odhikar Parishad, has reminded that if the ruling party creates chaos and carries out unlawful activities on the streets, people will strongly resist them. He made these remarks on Monday (10 November) afternoon while campaigning in the Gopalpara market area of Jhenaidah Sadar Upazila. He also said that there will be a vigilant public reaction against the Awami League's announced lockdown on 13 November of this month. Rashed Khan asserted that the parliament formed after the next election will be "free from Indian dominance." He argued that since the July uprising, the politics of thuggery and boss-rule has decreased here, and people will no longer accept that kind of governance. He said, "We may be few in number, but we are strong in resolve — we stand with revolutionary and change-seeking progress." Strongly criticizing the government, Rashed Khan said he had hoped Dr. Yunus would lead the country to the level of developed nations, but the government has failed to deliver on that promise. He alleged, "Dr. Yunus promises to make the country like America — that was a deceitful assurance; visible development is lacking." He called for judicial reform and said that raising questions about justice and reform has led to delays in holding the election. Rashed Khan further accused that because of the Awami League's activities, there are attempts to present some 'dummy' MPs in the election, and he warned that no dummy MPs will be allowed in the next election. He stated that if people try to spread unrest, they will be met with resistance on the streets.
