



Interim Government to Unveil 'July Declaration' on August 5

The 'July Declaration' will be officially unveiled on August 5 at 5:00 PM. The Interim Government has already finalized the draft of the declaration. This decision was made after a series of discussions with various political parties, the National Citizens' Committee, and student organizations.

In continuation of the political developments surrounding the 'July Uprising,' the 'July Declaration' has finally been finalized. According to a statement issued by the Interim Government on Saturday (August 2), this historic document will be presented to the nation on Tuesday, August 5, at 5:00 PM.

The statement mentioned that representatives of all parties involved in the mass uprising will be present at the declaration event. The aim is to present a unified roadmap before the nation. A detailed action plan will be announced during the event.

Earlier, on Friday night (August 1), in a Facebook post, Interim Government's Advisor on Information and Broadcasting Mahfuz Alam and LGED Advisor Asif Mahmud Sajib Bhuiyan stated that the 'July Declaration' would be announced by August 5.

It is worth noting that in December 2024, the National Citizens' Committee and the Anti-Discrimination Student Movement jointly initiated the effort to create an independent declaration. Although it was initially scheduled to be unveiled on December 31 at the Central Shaheed Minar, the responsibility was later taken over by the Interim Government based on inter-organizational unity. Subsequently, multiple meetings were held with political parties, their opinions were taken into account, and based on those, the final draft of the declaration was prepared.

It is believed that with the upcoming announcement on August 5, this document will serve as a foundation for political reform and national unity.
