



Chief Adviser Directs Military to Ensure Free and Fair Election

The Chief Adviser of the Interim Government, Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus, held a meeting with the Chiefs of the Bangladesh Army, Navy, and Air Force. The meeting took place on Saturday (November 1) around 7 p.m. at the Chief Adviser's official residence, Jamuna.

Present at the meeting were Army Chief General Waker-Uz-Zaman, Navy Chief Admiral M. Nazmul Hassan, and Air Force Chief Air Chief Marshal Hasan Mahmood Khan. National Security Adviser Dr. Khalilur Rahman also attended the meeting.

Discussions focused on strengthening security measures and overall preparedness to ensure that the upcoming 13th National Parliamentary Election is held in a peaceful, free, and impartial manner. The Chief Adviser instructed the heads of the three forces to take all necessary steps to maintain law and order and ensure national security during the election period.

The chiefs of the three services assured that the armed forces are fully prepared to deal with any possible situation surrounding the election and are ready to take necessary actions when required.

During the meeting, the Chief Adviser said, "The Interim Government is committed to ensuring that the upcoming national election, scheduled for the first half of February, is conducted freely, fairly, neutrally, and in a festive atmosphere."

In addition, the chiefs of the three forces invited the Chief Adviser to attend the upcoming Armed Forces Day celebration, scheduled for November 21.
