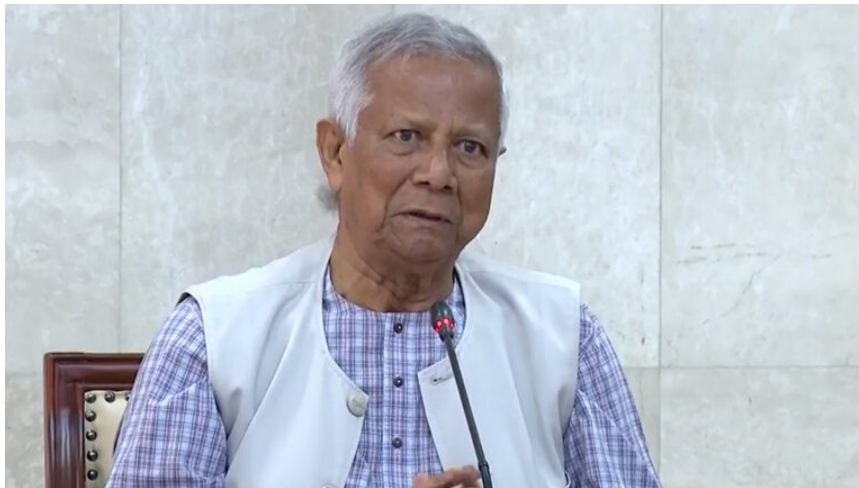




Janmashtami 2025: Dr. Muhammad Yunus Extends Greetings, Calls for Unity and Communal Harmony
