



13th National Parliamentary Elections Likely in February 2026: Chief Adviser Yunus

Chief Adviser of the interim government, Professor Muhammad Yunus, has hinted that the 13th National Parliamentary Elections may be held in February 2026. In a televised address to the nation on Tuesday night (August 5), he announced that the Election Commission will be officially requested to arrange the elections before the start of Ramadan.

Delivering his election-related message after 8 PM, Professor Yunus stated, “On behalf of the interim government, I will send a letter to the Chief Election Commissioner, urging him to initiate preparations for holding the national elections before the upcoming Ramadan.”

Based on weather conditions and moon sightings, Ramadan in 2026 is expected to commence on February 17. Consequently, the elections are anticipated to take place within the first half of February.

The Chief Adviser’s announcement has injected momentum into the country’s political landscape regarding the electoral process. With the roadmap now partially unveiled, all eyes are on the Election Commission’s formal declaration and the subsequent detailed action plan, which are now seen as matters of time.
