



US Iran agreement signing may take place in Geneva

A possible memorandum of understanding between the United States and Iran could be signed in Geneva, Switzerland, according to CNN. Sources suggest the event may take place by Sunday.

The report says preparations for a potential signing are already underway, and if everything proceeds as planned, an official announcement could follow within days.

Earlier, US President Donald Trump mentioned the possibility of a major agreement with Iran and indicated that a signing ceremony could be arranged in Europe. He also suggested that Vice President JD Vance might attend the event.

However, Iranian officials have not confirmed that any deal has been finalized, saying that discussions are still ongoing.

Diplomatic sources also say Geneva is being considered as a potential venue, though Vienna is also under discussion. No final decision has been made yet regarding the agreement's name, location, or schedule.

According to the sources, such an agreement could pave the way for the next phase of implementation and play a significant role in reducing regional tensions.
