



Jamaat Chief Diagnosed with 3 Major Heart Blockages Emergency Bypass Surgery to Be Conducted Locally

Dr. Shafiqur Rahman, Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami, has been diagnosed with three significant blockages in his heart. After reviewing his angiogram report, doctors have decided to proceed with urgent bypass surgery. The news was confirmed on Wednesday by his personal assistant, Mohammad Nazrul Islam

According to Nazrul, Dr. Rahman suddenly fell ill while delivering a speech during a recent party rally at Suhrawardy Udyan. Following the incident, a series of medical tests were conducted, culminating in an angiogram on Wednesday that revealed the presence of three major blockages.

The angiogram was conducted under the supervision of cardiologist Dr. Mominuzzaman. Based on the findings, the medical team recommended bypass surgery instead of angioplasty.

Although there were discussions within the party regarding sending Dr. Rahman abroad for treatment, he declined the proposal, expressing his full confidence in the country's healthcare system. As a result, the decision has been made to carry out the bypass surgery in Bangladesh without delay.

Meanwhile, both Dr. Rahman and his family have requested prayers from the nation for his speedy recovery. Party officials have also been engaged in discussions regarding his condition and medical care
