



Strait of Hormuz will not open over Trump remarks: IRGC

Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) has stated that it maintains full control over the Strait of Hormuz, while also dismissing recent remarks by former U.S. President Donald Trump as irrelevant. The IRGC made it clear that there is no question of opening this strategic waterway for its adversaries.

The information was reported by Al Jazeera on Wednesday (April 1). Earlier, Trump claimed that the Iranian president had proposed a ceasefire. However, he added a condition that the United States would not consider any ceasefire unless the Strait of Hormuz was operating normally, safely, and freely for navigation.

Meanwhile, Tehran has not officially confirmed any such ceasefire proposal. Instead, the IRGC's statement suggests that Iran is not willing to compromise on the strategically vital Strait of Hormuz and is firmly maintaining its position.
