



Special Forces Rescue Missing Crew in U.S. Operation in Iran

New details have emerged regarding the crew members of a U.S. F-15E fighter jet that crashed during recent clashes in Iran. The United States has claimed that one crew member has been rescued through a special operation conducted after the aircraft went down.

According to a report by Al Jazeera on Sunday (April 5), the second crew member was recovered following intense gunfire. However, the individual has not yet been moved to a fully secure location. A U.S. official stated that the operation is still ongoing to ensure safe extraction.

Meanwhile, Iran's Tasnim News Agency reported that the pilot of the downed aircraft managed to eject safely. It also claimed that U.S. special forces are continuing operations to recover the pilot.

There are also allegations that multiple strikes were carried out in different areas of Iran's Kohgiluyeh and Boyer-Ahmad province, based on the suspected location of the pilot.

In addition, reports suggest that another flight crew member is still missing. Operations and strikes are reportedly ongoing in several locations to locate the individual. However, these claims have not been independently verified. The situation remains uncertain, and the operation is still in progress.
