



Establishing justice was one of the Prophet's key teachings: President

President Mirza Fakhru'l Islam Alamgir has said that establishing a society based on justice was one of the key teachings of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH).

He made the remarks on Tuesday (August 25) while inaugurating a fortnight-long Seerat-un-Nabi (PBUH) programme at Baitul Mukarram marking Eid-e-Milad-un-Nabi (PBUH).

The President said establishing human dignity and building a just society were among the Prophet's key teachings. He said hatred, conflict, intolerance, discrimination, extremism, falsehood and moral degradation are increasing across the world, and there is no alternative to following the Prophet's teachings to overcome these challenges.

He said religious people in Bangladesh would be able to practice their faith freely, while people of all religions would live safely and with dignity. Justice, equality, human dignity and mutual harmony would serve as the foundations of the state and society. He added that, in line with the BNP government's pledge, all mosques and other places of worship across the country would be brought under a monthly honorarium scheme before 2030.

Stressing that division, hostility and revenge do not make a nation stronger, the President said authoritarianism, fascism and injustice of the past must never return. He called on everyone to remain united to protect democracy, justice, good governance and people's fundamental rights.
