



Allegations Emerge Against Saudi Arabia Over Secret Strikes on Iran

International sources have claimed that Saudi Arabia secretly carried out air operations in response to Iranian attacks. However, Saudi authorities have neither confirmed nor denied the reports. Likewise, Iran has avoided making any official comment on the matter.

For years, Saudi Arabia has relied heavily on security support from the United States, but recent tensions have raised concerns over its own national security. Iranian drone and missile attacks reportedly targeted military bases, airports, and oil facilities across the Gulf region. Instability in the Strait of Hormuz also affected global trade routes.

According to a report by The Wall Street Journal, the United Arab Emirates also took military action against Iran. The report suggests that Gulf Arab states have begun responding more directly to Iranian attacks.

Despite this, Saudi Arabia and the UAE appeared to differ strategically in their approach. While the UAE adopted a tougher stance, Saudi Arabia publicly called for de-escalation and continued diplomatic communication with Tehran. Reports indicate that discussions between the two countries also continued through the Iranian ambassador stationed in Riyadh.

Western and Iranian sources claim that Saudi Arabia warned Iran of stronger retaliation following the attacks. Diplomatic activity between the two sides later intensified, eventually leading to an informal understanding aimed at reducing tensions. Analysts believe both countries realized that an uncontrolled conflict could push the entire Middle East toward a wider war.

Tensions between Saudi Arabia and Iran had eased somewhat after diplomatic relations were restored in 2023 through Chinese mediation. However, the recent conflict has once again strained ties between the two regional rivals. To help stabilize the situation, Pakistan reportedly deployed fighter jets to Saudi Arabia and urged all parties to exercise restraint.
