



Tehran Rejects Washington's Five-Point Proposal

The United States has taken a tough stance in response to Iran's proposal aimed at easing tensions in the Middle East. According to international media reports, Washington presented Tehran with a five-point set of conditions without offering any economic or military concessions.

Iranian media claimed that the US wants Iran to operate only one nuclear facility and hand over its enriched uranium stockpile. The Trump administration has also reportedly refused to release frozen Iranian assets or provide compensation for war-related damages. Meanwhile, amid rising tensions, a drone attack targeted the Barakah Nuclear Power Plant in the United Arab Emirates. Although a generator caught fire, no casualties were reported.

Iran, on the other hand, stated that lasting peace in the Middle East would require an end to all wars in the region, the lifting of naval blockades, and the removal of sanctions. Tehran also reaffirmed that control over the Strait of Hormuz would remain in its hands.

The situation has become more complicated due to escalating threats from both sides. President Donald Trump warned of serious consequences if a quick agreement is not reached, while Iran's military also threatened a strong response.

At the same time, Pakistan is continuing mediation efforts to keep both parties engaged in dialogue. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif expressed hope that renewed talks could pave the way for lasting peace in the Middle East.
