



Extortion and Corruption on the Rise, Attempts to Create Instability

Business owners in the country—whether small or large—are no longer safe, as the burden of extortion continues to increase. Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Dr. Shafiqur Rahman alleged that although some people are not in power, they are still eager to display their influence and are attempting to create instability through coup attempts.

Speaking at the divisional rally of the 8-party alliance at Khulna's Shibbari Mor on Monday (1 December), he said, "If anyone, out of frustration or anger, tries to walk down the wrong path, the people will show firm resistance if necessary." He added that certain groups are trying to divide the nation. Giving an example, he said, "Just as a shrimp moves backward when it cannot find a way forward, some people are trying to drag the nation backward."
